SUBJECT: No. California Laborers' Master Labor Agreement
Fringe Benefit Rate **ADJUSTMENTS**, Effective
JANUARY 1, 2024.

Early last December, the NAEC was informed that the Laborers Union and several signatory associations had made the following adjustments to the fringe benefits rates effective January 1, 2024. The NAEC notified all members of these fringe benefit adjustments in our Labor Relations Bulletin #17-23 dated December 10, 2023.

Recently, we were notified by one of our members that NAEC Labor Relations Bulletin #4-24 dated June 3, 2024 did not reflect these fringe benefit adjustments. Please see attached corrections to NAEC Labor Relations Bulletin #4-24 reflecting these fringe benefit adjustments as follows:

OVERTIME

One and one-half (1-1/2) the regular straight time hourly rate shall be paid for all work on Saturdays (except on make-up days) and before a shift begins and after it ends. Double the regular straight time hourly rate shall be paid for all work on Sundays, holidays, and as provided for by state law. Men working a complete shift of shift work on Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays shall be paid eight (8) hours of pay at the appropriate overtime rate for seven (7) hours of work on the second and third shifts only.

HOLIDAYS

The holidays observed are Saturdays, Sundays, New Year's Day, Presidents' Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day (Fourth of July), Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, the day after Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day. Holidays falling on Sunday shall be observed on the following Monday.

NOTE: Martin Luther King, Jr. Day will become a recognized holiday when and if the five (5) basic crafts adopt it as a holiday.
